Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of The Universe (November 23, 2025)

This week’s reflection

In his letter to the Colossians, St. Paul reminds us that we have been made worthy to come into the kingdom of Jesus through his death on the cross and his rising to new life.

Jesus is the center of God’s plan of creation: “All were created through him, and for him. He is before all else that is.” Jesus is the “image of the invisible God,” an obvious reference to Adam’s creation in God’s image. Jesus, then, is the ideal human being; he shows us our real potential as human beings because of God’s great love.

Jesus is also the agent of redemption, the new creation. As he was the firstborn of all creatures, Jesus is also the firstborn from the dead. As all things were created in him, so he reconciles everything in his person. Today we acclaim him head of the Church and ruler of the universe.

The Gospel reading reminds us that Jesus is King, and his throne is the cross. His kingship is one of love and sacrifice, not power and dominion.

While we join the Church in acclaiming Jesus as King, the Gospel reminds us that Jesus’ reign is ultimately exercised in the mind and heart of each believer. Like the thief on the cross, each of us must recognize Jesus in faith. Like him, our prayer at the moment of death can be: “Jesus, remember me when you enter upon your reign.” And Jesus, our redeemer and Lord, will respond with loving compassion: “This day you will be with me in paradise.”

But we have work to do now for the building up of Jesus’ kingdom. His kingdom is one of justice and peace for every person. Every person, regardless of race or creed or economic status, possesses dignity as an image of God. Everyone has a right and a responsibility to contribute his or her talents in the making of human society.

As faithful disciples of Jesus, you and I are asked to treat everyone with reverence and help them to recognize and respect their own dignity as an image of God. We can also make efforts to help transform our society to be more just and less violent. May Jesus be King for us – the center of our hearts. May he transform us more completely in his image, so that we are better able to see his image in one another and in everyone we meet.

"All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy."

Not only might it make Jack dull: it might cripple his attempts to be happy, healthy, and even holy.

Make no mistake. Growing in holiness - making real in our own lives the love of the God in whose image and likeness we are created - is serious business. It requires hard work; it requires discipline; it requires self-examination; it requires commitment.

As Francis de Sales would say, it requires devotion.

But Salesian spirituality also recognizes the value of relaxation, of taking 'time out,' of 'catching your breath,' of making time for play. In fact, relaxation is not only permissible: it is necessary!

Francis de Sales claims: "It is actually a defect to be so strict, austere and unsocial that one neither permits oneself nor others any recreation time."

The Introduction to the Devout Life (1609) contains ample evidence of the Gentleman Saint's appreciation of the important role that recreation plays in the pursuit of a fully human, God-centered life. He says: "From time to time we must recreate in

mind and body."

He continues: "To take the air, to go for a walk, to enjoy a friendly chat, to play music, or sing or hunt...are such honest diversions that the only thing needed to utilize them well is simple prudence, which gives to all things their rank, time, place and measure."

To be balanced, we need to know our limitations. St. Jane once wrote in the context of a letter to a member of her community: "I must run, for I have little leisure and my arm and hand are starting to tire and hurt, even though I've just begun to write. I'm not able to do as much as I used to."

In his book Touching the Ordinary, Robert Wicks identifies practices that can help us establish and maintain a balanced life: get enough sleep; eat right; practice leisure; pace yourself. Learn to laugh; focus on values; practice self-appreciation; be involved, but not too involved; have a support group; escape on occasion; be spontaneous; avoid negativity. Establish good friendships; practice intimacy.

Of course, there are also the spiritual practices - pray; participate in the life of the Church; celebrate the sacraments; read Scripture and other material that

nourishes the soul.

Our Lord Jesus Christ spent virtually his entire public ministry meeting the needs of others: healing, teaching, feeding, challenging, forgiving: in short, working. But the Gospels that document Christ's work ethic also clearly document those times when he withdrew from his activities to rest, to renew, to enjoy another's hospitality, to spend time with friends, all helpful in rededicating himself to doing the Will of God.

There are plenty of ways to achieve balance between work and play, livelihood and leisure, pay and play. Consider them in a personal, prayerful manner. Choose those consistent with the state and stage of life in which you find yourself at this time: what works for others may not work for you. Realize that as your life changes, so too may your means for achieving this happy, healthy and holy balance.

As you travel along the highway of life, take your foot off the gas now and then. Ride with the windows down. Pull over on occasion. Visit the rest stop. Check out the scenic overlooks. Balancing work and play will not only help you to reach your destination in one piece, but it may enable you to truly enjoy the trip!

Reflexión de esta semana

En su carta a los Colosenses, San Pablo nos recuerda que, por su muerte en la cruz y su resurrección a una nueva vida, hemos sido hechos dignos de entrar en el reino de Jesús.

Jesús es el centro del plan de la creación de Dios: «Todo fue creado por medio de él y para él. Él es anterior a todo lo que existe». Jesús es la «imagen del Dios invisible», una clara referencia a la creación de Adán a imagen de Dios. Jesús, entonces, es el ser humano ideal; nos muestra nuestro verdadero potencial como seres humanos gracias al inmenso amor de Dios.

Jesús es también el agente de la redención, la nueva creación. Como fue el primogénito de todas las criaturas, Jesús es también el primogénito de entre los muertos. Así como todas las cosas fueron creadas en él, él reconcilia todo en su persona. Hoy lo aclamamos cabeza de la Iglesia y soberano del universo.

La lectura del Evangelio nos recuerda que Jesús es Rey, y su trono es la cruz. Su reinado es de amor y sacrificio, no de poder y dominio.

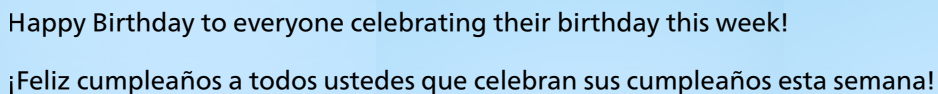

Como el ladrón en la cruz, cada uno de nosotros debe reconocer a Jesús por la fe. Como él, nuestra oración en el momento de la muerte puede ser: «Jesús, acuérdate de mí cuando entres en tu reino». Y Jesús, nuestro redentor y Señor, responderá con amorosa compasión: «Hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso».

Pero ahora tenemos trabajo por hacer para la edificación del reino de Jesús. Su reino es de justicia y paz para toda persona. Toda persona, sin importar su raza, credo o condición económica, posee dignidad como imagen de Dios. Todos tienen el derecho y la responsabilidad de aportar sus talentos a la construcción de la sociedad humana.

Como fieles discípulos de Jesús, se nos pide que tratemos a todos con reverencia y les ayudemos a reconocer y respetar su propia dignidad como imagen de Dios. También podemos esforzarnos por ayudar a transformar nuestra sociedad para que sea más justa y menos violenta.

Que Jesús sea nuestro Rey, el centro de nuestros corazones. Que nos transforme plenamente a su imagen, para que podamos ver mejor su imagen en los demás y en todas las personas que encontremos.
