"Saints...for Sinners"



The saints are heroes of our faith tradition. They are men, women and children who convincingly demonstrate in their own lives the transforming, redeeming and inspiring love of God. They are people who challenge us, through words and works, to make use of that same transforming, redeeming and inspiring love of God in our own lives. In short, they are people to whom we look up; they are people we admire. They remind us God can accomplish in us the kinds of things God accomplished in them. But the stories of the saints are more than a consideration of the promise of human strength, courage, fidelity and tenacity. Their stories are also powerful reminders of the reality of human frailty, weakness and infidelity.

In a sermon he preached on Palm Sunday, March 1622, Francis de Sales observed: "All creatures, you see, are a mixture of perfection and imperfection. For this reason, they can be used as symbols of either. Every person, no matter how holy, has some imperfections. Made in God's image, each person reflects something of God's goodness while, at the same time, that same person carries some imperfections." (*Pulpit and Pew*)

To overlook the vices of the saints is, paradoxically, to run the risk of diminishing their virtues. St. Francis preached: "We do no harm to the saints by pointing out their failings and their sins as well as their virtues. In fact, biographers do a tremendous disservice to them by hiding or drawing a veil over the early part of their lives for fear of lowering our opinion of their sanctity. This is a great mistake, an injustice to the saints and all who follow them." (*Ibid*)

Francis de Sales believed that we have as much to learn from the setbacks of the saints as we do from their successes. "It is a good thing to see the defects in the lives of the saints. It not only shows God's goodness in forgiving them, but it also teaches us to imitate the saints in their efforts to overcome their failings and to do penance for them. We study the virtues of the saints in order to imitate them; we study the failings of the saints in order to avoid them." (*Ibid*)

Consider Saint Peter. Of Peter, Francis wrote: "St. Peter was chosen to be the chief of the apostles, although he was subject to so many imperfections that he even committed some after receiving the Holy Spirit. Still, notwithstanding his defects, he was al-

ways full of courage, never allowing himself to be dismayed by his shortcomings." (*Conferences*, IV, 63)

Francis commented: "Who would not marvel at the heart of St. Peter, so bold among armed soldiers that he alone takes his sword in hand and strikes out with it? Yet, just a short time later, among unarmed people, he is so cowardly that at the mere word of a servant girl he denies and detests his master." (*Treatise*, Book X, 9)

This way of looking at the saints can be most helpful in our everyday attempts to "Live Jesus". Seeing the defects of the saints can serve as a strong vaccine against any dismay or discouragement we may experience when faced with our own sins, failings and imperfections. At the same time, seeing the virtues of the saints can dissuade us from becoming smug or self-satisfied with our shortcomings.

The saints have much to teach us about how to pursue a life of devotion: overcoming our sins and failings, strengthening our practice of virtue. Francis de Sales (himself a saint) wants us to see the saints as real people, to realize that we can learn from their tragedies as well as from their triumphs.

The Scrutinies: This weekend our Parish will be celebrating the Rite of the Second Scrutiny at the 9:30 am English Mass, and the 11:30 am Spanish Mass. The Scrutinies are three special rites that help prepare the Elect, those participating in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), to enter the Catholic Church. They take place during the period of RCIA formation known as Purification and Enlightenment, near the end of their formation. The Catechumen being recognized this week will be Baptized in the Catholic Faith at the Easter Vigil Mass. The Scrutinies are associated with three specific Gospel stories on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent:

- Jesus encountering the Samaritan woman at the well, where He offers Himself as the Living Water, ([March 23](#))
- Jesus healing the man born blind, where He gives Himself as Light of the World ([March 30](#))
- Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead, where He reveals Himself as the Resurrection and the Life ([April 6](#))

Sunday's Reflection

In today's Gospel (option from Cycle A) we experience Jesus healing a man born blind. It is God in Jesus Christ who gives us the eyes of faith to see more fully the mystery of divine love. St. Francis de Sales explains how God entices us to on-going conversion:

Only God can enlighten us and open our blind eyes. When God gives us faith, God enters us and incites our mind through inspirations. So pleasantly does God propose the mysteries of faith to us that, without doubt or opposition, we consent to them.

Faith, the best friend of our spirit, brings us to love the beauty of the truths of the mystery of God. When we are exposed to the rays of the noonday sun, we scarcely see its light before we quickly feel its heat. So it is with the light of faith. As soon as the light of faith casts its light on us, we feel the heat of heavenly love. Faith makes us know with certitude that God exists and that God is infinite goodness. When temptations against faith start raising questions, we have to answer with our heart, not reason. Reason admits its limitations. It tells us that while the mystery of God transcends our ability to reason, our faith in God is eminently reasonable. Like St. Augustine, let us affirm our faith by crying out, "Lord I do believe, but help me in my unbelief!"

Let us faithfully concentrate on nourishing God's gift of on-going conversion with awe and confidence. Let us make God's love effective in our lives by remaining steady and persevering in our good desires and holy resolutions. Without forcing or doing any violence to us, Jesus draws us to Himself by bonds of love and gentleness so that we begin to do all things through holy love. Then let us not be afraid of our Lord who wants to take full possession of our hearts. Rather, let us surrender ourselves lovingly into the hands of Our Savior, who desires to do great things in us, if we let Him open our eyes.

Los Escrutinios: Este fin de semana, nuestra parroquia celebrará el Rito del Segundo Escrutinio en la misa en inglés de las 9:30 a. m. y en español de las 11:30 a. m. Los Escrutinios son tres ritos especiales que preparan a los Elegidos, quienes participan en la Orden de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos (OCIA), para ingresar a la Iglesia Católica. Se llevan a cabo durante el período de formación del RICA, conocido como Purificación e Iluminación, cerca del final de su formación. El catecúmeno que se reconoce esta semana será bautizado en la fe católica en la misa de la Vigilia Pascual. Los Escrutinios están relacionados con tres relatos evangélicos específicos del tercer, cuarto y quinto domingo de Cuaresma: Jesús se encuentra con la samaritana en el pozo, donde se ofrece como el Agua Viva (23 de marzo).

- Jesús sana al ciego de nacimiento, donde se entrega como la Luz del Mundo (30 de marzo).

Reflexión Semanal

En el Evangelio de hoy (opción del Ciclo A), experimentamos la curación de un ciego de nacimiento por parte de Jesús. Es Dios en Jesucristo quien nos da los ojos de la fe para comprender mejor el misterio del amor divino. San Francisco de Sales explica cómo Dios nos incita a una conversión continua:

Solo Dios puede iluminarnos y abrir nuestros ojos ciegos. Cuando Dios nos da la fe, entra en nosotros e incita nuestra mente mediante inspiraciones. Dios nos propone con tanta dulzura los misterios de la fe que, sin dudar ni oponernos, los aceptamos.

La fe, la mejor amiga de nuestro espíritu, nos lleva a amar la belleza de las verdades del misterio de Dios. Cuando nos exponemos a los rayos del sol del mediodía, apenas vemos su luz, sentimos enseguida su calor. Lo mismo ocurre con la luz de la fe. En cuanto la luz de la fe nos ilumina, sentimos el calor del amor celestial. La fe nos hace saber con certeza que Dios existe y que Dios es bondad infinita. Cuando las tentaciones contra la fe nos planteen interrogantes, debemos responder con el corazón, no con la razón. La razón admite sus limitaciones. Nos dice que, si bien el misterio de Dios trasciende nuestra capacidad de razonamiento, nuestra fe en Dios es eminentemente razonable. Como San Agustín, afirmemos nuestra fe clamando: «Señor, creo, pero ayúdame en mi incredulidad».

Concentrémonos fielmente en alimentar el don de Dios de la conversión continua con asombro y confianza. Hagamos que el amor de Dios sea eficaz en nuestras vidas, manteniéndonos firmes y perseverantes en nuestros buenos deseos y santos propósitos. Sin forzarnos ni forzarnos, Jesús nos atrae hacia sí con lazos de amor y dulzura para que comencemos a hacer todas las cosas por amor santo. Entonces, no temamos a nuestro Señor, que quiere tomar plena posesión de nuestros corazones. MÁS BIEN, ABANDONÉMONOS AMOROSAMENTE EN LAS MANOS DE NUESTRO SALVADOR, QUE DESEA HACER GRANDES COSAS EN NOSOTROS, SI LE PERMITIMOS ABIERNOS LOS OJOS.


