

### Sunday's Reflection

Today's Gospel focuses our attention on the Holy Family, as members of a wider family, the family of God. The Father has bestowed His great love on us in calling us His children, brothers and sisters of Jesus who has shared His very life with us. Our Father's final gift to His children will be seeing our God as He is – full union with our God forever. The Spirit has been given to us as the pledge of God's everlasting love.

As God's children, we are asked to reflect on a strange incident in the life of the Holy Family. What might we learn? When Mary and Joseph discovered that the boy Jesus was missing, they didn't waste their time arguing about who was to blame. Together, they went to search for Jesus. When they find Him in the Temple among the scholars, they expressed their anguish about missing Him. Jesus focused them by reminding them that they should expect to find Him in His Father's house.


Jesus was asking them to trust Him, even if they didn't fully understand.

In our experience in the family of God here at Childs, there are often enough misunderstandings and anguish of one kind or another. We can lose sight of Jesus in these difficult moments. Jesus instructs us, as He did Mary and Joseph: "Did you not know that I must be in My Father's house?"

Each day we come here to find Jesus in our Father's house. Like Mary and Joseph, we can tell Jesus about our misunderstandings and anguish. Jesus always invites us to put them in His hands, then hear our brother's comforting words to us and join Him in offering our sufferings with His to the Father. And He feeds us with His own Body and Blood and gives us His peace. Healed and nourished, we can go forth to grow in wisdom, knowledge and grace as a more united family of God.

May our Eucharist on the feast of the Holy Family encourage us to live more fully as children of our Father, as brothers and sisters of Jesus.

## Reflexión Semanal

El saludo del ángel Gabriel a María contenía dos mensajes discretos, pero relacionados: (1) María sería la madre El Evangelio de hoy centra nuestra atención en la Sagrada Familia, como miembros de una familia más amplia, la familia de Dios. El Padre nos ha otorgado su gran amor al llamarnos sus hijos, hermanos y hermanas de Jesús, que ha compartido su vida con nosotros. El regalo final de nuestro Padre a sus hijos será ver a nuestro Dios tal como es: la unión plena con nuestro Dios para siempre. El Espíritu nos ha sido dado como la garantía del amor eterno de Dios.

Como hijos de Dios, se nos pide que reflexionemos sobre un extraño incidente en la vida de la Sagrada Familia. ¿Qué podemos aprender? Cuando María y José descubrieron que el niño Jesús había desaparecido, no perdieron el tiempo discutiendo sobre quién era el culpable. Juntos, fueron a buscar a Jesús. Cuando lo encontraron en el Templo entre los eruditos, expresaron su angustia por no haberlo encontrado. Jesús los centró en ellos recordándoles que debían esperar encontrarlo en la casa de su Padre.

Jesús les estaba pidiendo que confiaran en Él, incluso si no entendían del todo.

En nuestra experiencia en la familia de Dios aquí en Childs, a menudo hay bastantes malentendidos y angustias de un tipo u otro. Podemos perder de vista a Jesús en estos momentos difíciles. Jesús nos instruye, como lo hizo con María y José: "¿No sabíais que yo debo estar en la casa de mi Padre?"

Cada día venimos aquí para encontrar a Jesús en la casa de nuestro Padre. Como María y José, podemos contarle a Jesús nuestros malentendidos y angustias. Jesús siempre nos invita a ponerlos en sus manos, luego escuchar las palabras reconfortantes de nuestro hermano y unirnos a Él para ofrecer nuestros sufrimientos junto con los suyos al Padre. Y Él nos alimenta con su propio Cuerpo y Sangre y nos da su paz. Sanados y nutritos, podemos avanzar para crecer en sabiduría, conocimiento y gracia como una familia de Dios más unida.






