Sunday's Reflection

Throughout history, God has fed His people generously.

He fed one hundred from the twenty barley loaves given to the prophet Elisha – and there was some left over as God had said. The Gospel recounts Jesus feeding five thousand with five barley loaves and two fish - and leftovers filled twelve baskets. God truly visits His people and feeds them generously.

But these signs were only hints of God's generous care. At the Last Supper Jesus ate with his disciples, He takes bread and a cup of wine and gives thanks and tells them to eat. He tells them that the bread they are eating is His body soon to be given for them, and the wine is now His blood soon to be poured out on the cross for the sins of all. Then He instructs them to continue this sacred rite in remembrance of Him.

You and I are here today to continue to fulfill that command of Jesus. Each time we celebrate Eucharist, Jesus feeds us with His body and blood. Our God comes to be one with us. St. Peter Chrysologus, an early writer of the Church, asks us to open our minds and hearts to the wonder of this gift: "God always gives greater gifts than He is asked for. ... He gives Himself as food to be eaten. ...(And God promises) 'You who have continued with Me will eat and drink at My table in My kingdom.' He who prepares such great provisions to sustain you on your journey, what has he not prepared for you in that ever-lasting abode? So, do not be anxious about the quality of this banquet."

If our God has provided the body and blood of Jesus as food for our journey, then His promise for the future will be just as surprising and generous. What, then, are we to do as we journey? St. Paul tells us: "live in a manner worthy of the call you have received." Live humbly, gently, patiently, bearing with one another through love. Strive to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace.

He is reminding us to remember the food we have eaten and allow Jesus to fill us with Himself. As we remember, we are called to live as Jesus did, to love as Jesus loved, to be humble and sentle and patient as Jesus was, to be transformed more and more in the image of Jesus so that we can be Jesus' presence in our world. The gifts of God are generous; the Gift-giver calls us to be generous in turn.

Reflexión Semanal

Les dice que el pan que están comiendo es Su cuerpo que pronto será entregado por ellos, y el vino es ahora Su sangre que pronto será derramada en la cruz por los pecados de todos. Luego les instruye a continuar este rito sagrado en memoria de Él.

Tú y yo estamos aquí hoy para seguir cumpliendo ese mandato de Jesús. Cada vez que celebramos la Eucaristía, Jesús nos alimenta con Su cuerpo y sangre. Nuestro Dios viene a ser uno con nosotros. San Pedro Crisólogo, uno de los primeros escritores de la Iglesia, nos pide que abramos nuestra mente y nuestro corazón a la maravilla de este don: "Dios siempre da mayores dones de los que se le piden. ...Él se entrega como alimento para ser comido. ...(Y Dios promete) 'Ustedes que han permanecido conmigo, comerán y beberán en Mi mesa en Mi reino. El que prepara tan grandes provisiones para sustentarlos en su viaje, ¿qué no ha preparado para ustedes en ese eterno?' ¿morada? Así que no os preocupéis por la calidad de este banquete".

Si nuestro Dios ha provisto el cuerpo y la sangre de Jesús como alimento para nuestro viaje, entonces Su promesa para el futuro será igualmente sorprendente y generosa. Entonces, ¿qué debemos hacer mientras viajamos? San Pablo nos dice: "vive de manera digna del llamado que has recibido". Vivamos con humildad, dulzura y paciencia, soportándonos unos a otros mediante el amor. Esforzaos por preservar la unidad del espíritu a través del vínculo de la paz.

Nos recuerda que recordemos la comida que hemos comido y permitamos que Jesús nos llene de sí mismo. Al recordar, estamos llamados a vivir como lo hizo Jesús, a amar como Jesús amó, a ser humildes, amables y pacientes como lo fue Jesús, a ser transformados cada vez más a la imagen de Jesús para que podamos ser la presencia de Jesús en nuestro mundo. Los dones de Dios son generosos; el Donante nos llama a ser a su vez generosos.

Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a particular church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled. Registration shows that you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining certificates, and getting contribution statements for taxes. You will also receive a packet of envelopes to place your regular contributions. This is important if you want to receive a year-end statement from the parish for income tax purposes. If you do not wish to receive weekly contribution envelopes, this should not be a reason not to register. Just let the secretary know, and envelopes will not



Saint Francis De Sales August 2024 St. Mary Magdalene – Feast Day July 22



Mary Magdalene (sometimes called Mary of Magdala, or simply the Magdalene or the Madeleine) was a woman who, according to the four canonical gospels, traveled with Jesus as one of His followers and was a witness to the crucifixion and resurrection. She is mentioned by name twelve times in the canonical gospels, more than most of the apostles and more than any other woman in the gospels, other than Jesus's family. Mary's epithet *Magdalene* may be a toponymic surname, meaning that she came from the town of Magdala, a fishing town on the western shore of the Sea of Galilee in Roman Judea.

The Gospel of Luke chapter 8 lists Mary Magdalene as one of the women who travelled with Jesus and helped support his ministry "out of their resources", indicating that she was possibly wealthy. The same passage also states that seven demons had been driven out of her, a statement which is repeated from Mark 16. In all four canonical (i.e. those in the Bible) gospels, Mary Magdalene is a witness to the crucifixion of Jesus and, in the Synoptic Gospels, Matthew, Mark and Luke, so named because they have striking visual similarities, she is also present at His burial. All four gospels identify her, either alone or as a member of a larger group of women, as the first to witness the empty tomb, and, either alone or as a member of a group, as the first to witness the resurrected Jesus.

Mary Magdalene is considered to be a saint by the Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican, and Lutheran denominations. In 2016, Pope Francis raised the level of liturgical memory on July 22 from memorial to feast, and for her to be referred to as the "Apostle of the Apostles". Other Protestant churches honor her as a heroine of the faith.

Multiple legends and stories have been told about this saint. Some have been told since the early days of Christianity, such as she was the first or one of a group of the first people who saw the Risen Jesus and, by telling the Apostles, became the Apostle to the Apostles which was formalized, not bestowed, by Pope Francis. In Gnostic, i.e. non canonical writings which are considered as heretical by the Church due to their insistence on the need for special knowledge or gnosis in the Greek, she is portrayed as being the disciple Jesus loved and was the only one who understood His teachings. In some of these writings she is depicted as the wife or even as the concubine of Jesus, so its not difficult to see why these writings were rejected and condemned as heretical by the Church.

The idea of Mary being the wife of Jesus was revived in more modern times where she is portrayed as a wife in the 1955 novel *The Last Temptation of Christ* and in the 1988 film adaptation of the same title. As He is dying on the cross, Jesus has a vision sent from Satan of what it would be like if He married Mary Magdalene and raised a family with her instead of dying for humanity's sins. This is a truly devilish last-ditch attempt by Satan to tempt Christ.

More recently Dan Brown's 2003 bestselling mystery thriller novel *The Da Vinci Code* popularized a number of controversial ideas about Mary Magdalene, that she was Jesus's wife, that she was pregnant at the crucifixion, and that she gave birth to Jesus's child, who became the founder of a bloodline which survives to this very day.

There is no reliable historical evidence from the Biblical or apocryphal (not accepted by the Church but not quite to the level of being heretical) gospels, other early Christian writings, or any other ancient sources to support these statements. *The Da Vinci Code* also purports that the figure of the "beloved disciple" to Jesus's right in Leonardo da Vinci's *Last Supper* is Mary Magdalene, disguised as one of the male disciples; art historians however maintain that the figure is, in fact, the apostle John.

Mary Magdalene has had the reputation in Western Christianity as being a repentant prostitute; however, this assertion is not supported by the canonical gospels, which at no point imply that she had ever been a prostitute or was in any way notable for a sinful way of life. The notion of Mary Magdalene being a former prostitute or loose woman dates to an Easter homily by Pope Gregory I ("Gregory the Great") dated 591, in which he identifies Magdalene with the anonymous sinner with the perfume in Luke's gospel. For the first time, her sins are explicitly identified as being not only of a sexual nature, but as being the seven deadly sins representing the seven demons that were cast out of Mary as also described in Luke.

Despite lack of biblical evidence, the idea of the sinful but repenting Mary took hold, and in the ensuing centuries Mary the repentant prostitute came to replace Mary the Apostle to the Apostles. She became a frequent subject of medieval art due to the irresistible combination of covering a great deal of exposed female skin with a thin veneer of "righteous" piety. This type of presentation was successfully duplicated in the 1950's Hollywood Biblical blockbuster movies.

Lacking any Biblical proof of a previous sinful life we would do well to concentrate on Mary's unwavering devotion to Jesus, her witness to His resurrection and her role in early Christianity. Rather than focusing on spurious stereotypes we can better appreciate her as a devoted disciple and a key figure in the Gospel accounts.

Mary's reputation has certainly endured multiple tumultuous changes over the centuries, from Apostle to the Apostles to sinner to hooker to concubine/wife of Jesus to the mother of His mythical dynasty. So much for the claim that the roads to holiness and devotion are serene and peaceful. Both she and we will be better served by our adherence to the words of Sgt Joe Friday in the old Dragnet series "Just the facts Ma'am, just the (Biblical) facts."



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
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
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
